PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, on National POW/MIA Recognition Day, September 15, 2023, we pay tribute to the American men and women who never returned home from combat and to those who faced unthinkable suffering as prisoners of war in distant lands; and

WHEREAS, as a grateful Nation, we can never repay the profound debt to our heroes, and we are committed to accounting for the missing members of our Armed Forces; and

WHEREAS, there are nearly 1,400 Tennesseans still missing in action since World War II; and

WHEREAS, we demonstrate our deep gratitude and admiration for our brave patriots not in words alone, but by continuing to search for and bring home those missing in action from foreign battlefields; and

WHEREAS, the week beginning the third Friday of September and extending through the following Thursday of this year shall be designated as Tennessee POW/MIA Recognition Week in honor of the sacrifices made by citizens who were captured by the enemy or missing in action; and

WHEREAS, on September 15, 2023, the POW/MIA flag honoring America's prisoners of war and those missing in action will be flown over the Tennessee State Capitol and other locations across our country as a powerful reminder that our Nation will never cease to recover, remember, and honor the courageous men and women who have served and sacrificed so much for each of us.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim the week of September 15-21, 2023 as

POW/MIA Recognition Week

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
