PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, on February 29, 2012 through March 2, 2012, high straight line winds and tornadoes, heavy rain, and flooding occurred and resulted in a state of emergency due to conditions in Bradley, Claiborne, Cumberland, DeKalb, Hamilton, Jackson, McMinn, Monroe, Overton and Polk Counties; and

WHEREAS, this severe weather resulted an effective response and recovery; and

WHEREAS, emergency personnel will continue to support recovery after the devastating impact of this severe weather and flooding and activities have become more administrative in nature;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Tennessee Constitution and law, including but not limited to Tennessee Code Annotated Section 58-2-107(b), do terminate the state of emergency created by this event.
