PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, the primary mission of the Tennessee Association on Higher Education and Disability as a not-for-profit organization is to support professional educators and service providers in higher education through education, communication and professional development.

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Association on Higher Education and Disability provides professional support and development to post-secondary disability service providers in the state of Tennessee and to other individuals and organizations who are committed to the principles of equal access and opportunity for all qualified students with disabilities to become full self-determined participants in higher education.

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Association on Higher Education and Disability and its members are dedicated to supporting professional educators and service providers in higher education through education, communication and professional development.

WHEREAS, Higher Education and Disability Professionals make a critical impact in the postsecondary lives of qualifying students with disabilities including veterans.

WHEREAS, Higher Education and Disability Service Providers often function as directors, specialists, consultants, coaches, educators, counselors, community leaders, policymakers and researchers;

WHEREAS, Higher Education and Disability Service Providers support and often consult with parents, educators, and students to encourage a smooth transition to postsecondary educational opportunities.

WHEREAS, Higher Education Disability Service Providers are committed to providing appropriate confidential services, case management, and consultation for students, faculty, and other educational partners regarding the Americans with Disability Amendment Act, (ADAAA), Section 504 and other laws, policies, and procedures, affecting students with disabilities;

WHEREAS, Higher Education and Disability Service Providers believe that disability is diversity;

WHEREAS, Higher Education and Disability Service Providers are integrally involved in the retention and persistence of postsecondary students at their respective institutions;

NOW THEREFORE, in recognition that Tennessee's higher education systems and institutions would be less successful without the contributions of Higher Education and Disability Professionals, I, Governor Bill Haslam, proclaim the Week of April 8-14, 2012 as
