



STATE OF TENNESSEE
PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, up to a 8.5 million Americans suffer from peripheral artery disease (PAD), a potentially life threatening disease where plaque builds up along blood vessel walls, narrowing the arteries and reducing blood flow to the legs and feet; and

WHEREAS, Each year between 160,000-180,000 Americans undergo amputation of a limb as a result of complications associated with peripheral artery disease (PAD); and an estimated 12 to 20% of Americans over 60 has PAD and Americans with diabetes over 50 are at especially high risk for PAD; and

WHEREAS, Peripheral Artery Disease Awareness Month is observed every September in the United States by health experts, health advocates, and individuals concerned with vascular and arterial health; and

WHEREAS, Designating a month for the issue serves the purpose of increasing public awareness of peripheral artery disease; educating about the risk factors and symptoms of PAD; providing information about PAD screening; encouraging people to talk to their healthcare professional; informing citizens about physicians and healthcare facilities that specialize in limb salvage; educating people about treatment options and alternatives to amputation; and sharing stories of PAD's impact on citizens and how treatment can relieve symptoms and help them live more fulfilling lives; and

WHEREAS, citizens commemorated PAD awareness month with the "Take A Stand Against Amputation presents Nashville Sings Gospel Concert" hosted by Grammy-winning Gospel Great, Tennessee native, and PAD Awareness Ambassador Dr. Bobby Jones on September 17, 2016, in the city of Nashville;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim September, 2016 as

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
