## PROCLAMATION

## BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, preparing Tennesseans for disasters and emergencies is a priority of state government; and

WHEREAS, the preparedness of all Tennesseans for disasters and emergencies is a cooperative effort of businesses, citizens, families, and government working together; and

WHEREAS, Tennesseans may have to rely on themselves, their family, their friends and their neighbors in large disasters until first responders arrive; and

WHEREAS, educating our citizens on how to make an emergency preparedness kit and an emergency preparedness plan is vitally important to their being able to cope during disasters; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Emergency Management Agency is dedicated to raising preparedness awareness, and to providing critical information to the public during disasters and emergencies; and

WHEREAS, being able to alert and inform the public of potential emergencies, hazards, and threats, is critical to protecting and saving lives; and

WHEREAS, the Integrated Public Alert and Warning System (IPAWS) is a crucial technology that allows the efficient and effective delivery and dissemination of emergency public information from all levels of government; and

WHEREAS, TEMA will use IPAWS to conduct a statewide Wireless Emergency Alert test on Friday, September 1, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency will conduct a national test of the Emergency Alert System on Wednesday, September 27, 2017; and

WHEREAS, September is designated as National Preparedness Month;

**NOW THEREFORE,** I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim September, 2017 as

Preparedness Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
