PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, the people of Tennessee recognize the sacrifice of the members of our armed services and their families; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to honor those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in defense of our freedom; and

WHEREAS, we remember the families who have lost their loved ones in combat; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Army Staff Sergeant William Turner of Nashville, Tennessee, was presumably killed on December 13, 1943 while serving his country in World War II; and

WHEREAS, Turner served as a crew member of a B-26 bomber called "Hell's Fury" and was an aerial engineer assigned to the 555th Bomb Squadron, 386th Bomb Group; and

WHEREAS, the aircraft was struck by anti-aircraft artillery and crashed near Schiphol in The Netherlands; and

WHEREAS, Turner's remains will be returned to his native state and laid at rest in Nashville, Tennessee on August 22, 2017; and

WHEREAS, we are grateful to finally welcome home this brave soldier who made the ultimate sacrifice for his country;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim August 22, 2017 as a

Day of Mourning in Remembrance of Staff Sergeant William Turner

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
