**PROCLAMATION**  
BY THE GOVERNOR

**WHEREAS**, as Military Governor of the State of Tennessee, then-future-President Andrew Johnson freed his personal slaves on August 8, 1863 and;

**WHEREAS**, August 8<sup>th</sup> was a day to celebrate freedom in African American communities beginning in East Tennessee and gaining in popularity across the state in the 1800's and

**WHEREAS**, every American deserves the rights and freedoms afforded to them through the United States Constitution and given to them by Tennessee State Constitution and

**WHEREAS**, it is fitting to honor and remember a day that brought about freedom from bondage and slavery;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim August 8, 2018 as

*Emancipation Day*

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
