PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, there are more than 248,000 licensed Nurse Practitioners in the United States with 8,500 NP's practicing in the State of Tennessee providing high-quality, cost-effective patient-centered, personalized health care, and

WHEREAS, NP's have advanced education, with most having master's degrees and an increasing number with doctorates, and

WHEREAS, NP's order, perform and interpret diagnostic tests, diagnose and treat acute and chronic conditions, and prescribe medications and other treatments, and

WHEREAS, NP's are truly partners in the health care of their patients, so that in addition to clinical services, NP's focus on health promotion, disease prevention and health education and counseling, guiding patients to make smarter health and lifestyle choices, and

WHEREAS, the excellence, safety, and cost-effectiveness of the care provided by NP's is established and well-documented; and

WHEREAS, the faith and trust that patients have an NP-delivered health care is evidenced by the more than 916 million visits made to NP's annually; and

WHEREAS, more than 18 percent of NP's practice in rural settings with populations of less than 25,000 and

WHEREAS, NP's provide health care to people of all ages and in diverse health care settings such as private office practice, hospitals, long-term care facilities, schools, state and local health departments, managed care facilities, and retail-based clinics;
