



STATE OF TENNESSEE
PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, natural disasters at home and around the world remind us that Tennessee could face a catastrophic disaster on any day; and

WHEREAS, earthquakes present a constant threat of catastrophic damage and loss of life to Tennesseans, and preparation and awareness of the dangers by the public may help mitigate losses; and

WHEREAS, community preparedness depends on the preparedness of individuals in every sector of the community, public and private; and

WHEREAS, the safety of everyone in Tennessee improves when businesses, communities, individuals, families, government, neighborhoods, organizations, and schools come together to prepare for catastrophic earthquakes; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Emergency Management Agency, the West Tennessee Seismic Safety Commission, the University of Memphis Center for Earthquake Research and Information, the Mid-South Association of Contingency Planners, the Central U.S. Earthquake Consortium, Tennessee Structural Assessment and Visual Evaluation (SAVE) Coalition, and many other groups and individuals work year-round to promote earthquake awareness and safety in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, at 10:18 a.m. on October 18, 2018, many Tennesseans will participate in the Great Central U.S. Shake Out, a voluntary earthquake exercise, by practicing the "Drop, Cover & Hold" technique that could help prevent injury during an earthquake;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim October 18, 2018 as

Earthquake Shake-Out Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
