WHEREAS, Chronic Recurrent Multifocal Osteomyelitis, known as CRMO, is a rare, non-infectious autoinflammatory disease that typically presents in children; and

WHEREAS, persons suffering with CRMO often have periodic, severe bone pain, fevers, and multiple bone lesions; and

WHEREAS, persons suffering with CRMO have to endure frequent MRIs, lab tests, physical therapy, anti-inflammatory drugs, and many off-label drugs that can have devastating side effects; and

WHEREAS, the need for widespread awareness and understanding of CRMO is critical for meaningful research to continue so that the quality of life is improved for those with CRMO, and the hope for a cure becomes a reality; and

WHEREAS, CRMO Awareness Month is an opportunity to raise public consciousness of this illness;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim the month of October 2018 as
