WHEREAS, many trained professionals working at dedicated children's grief centers throughout the State of Tennessee offer bereavement support to children and their families; and

WHEREAS, such bereavement support services provides emotional support for children struggling with grief, allowing them to find guidance and understanding during an extremely difficult time; and

WHEREAS, on November 15, citizens are encouraged to wear blue in an effort to raise awareness and show their support for children in mourning;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim November 15, 2018 as
