PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, the people of Tennessee recognize the sacrifice of the members of our armed services and their families; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to honor those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in defense of our freedom; and

WHEREAS, we remember the families who have lost their loved ones in combat; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Army Air Force Second Lieutenant Martin O'Callaghan, Jr. of Memphis, Tennessee, was killed on February 15, 1945 while serving his country in World War II; and

WHEREAS, O'Callaghan, age 22, was serving as a pilot with the 96th Fighter Squadron, 82nd Fighter Group; and

WHEREAS, the P-38 aircraft he was flying was struck by anti-aircraft fire and crashed near Maribor, Yugoslavia (now Slovenia); and

WHEREAS, his remains will be returned to his native state and laid at rest in the West Tennessee State Veterans Cemetery in Memphis, Tennessee on November 5, 2018; and

WHEREAS, we are grateful to finally welcome home this brave soldier who made the ultimate sacrifice for his country;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim November 5, 2018 as a

Day of Mourning in Remembrance of Second Lieutenant Martin O'Callaghan, Jr.

and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
