## PROCLAMATION

## BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, Adverse Childhood Experiences; also known as ACEs, such as abuse, neglect, witness to violence, parental incarceration or death, or a parent who suffers from substance abuse or mental illness, are harmful events that can impact a child in all areas of life and throughout their entire life as individuals; an

WHEREAS, studies in the fields of neurobiology, psychology, epigenetics, child development, and medicine, among others, show that ACEs can cause toxic stress in children that can have lasting consequences to their physical and emotional health well into adulthood, and can be passed on to the next generation; and

WHEREAS, research shows that as the number of ACEs and exposure to toxic stress increase, so do the risks for negative health outcomes such as chronic diseases, obesity, premature death, mental illness, substance abuse, incarceration, and becoming a victim of violence; and

WHEREAS, since over 60% of adults in Tennessee have at least one ACE, our state is increasing its efforts and dedicating additional resources to transform how we address ACEs and promoting cultural change to better prevent and mitigate ACEs; and

WHEREAS, together, we can break the cycle of trauma whenever possible, by wrapping holistic services around children and families in need of such supports; and

WHEREAS, by helping Tennesseans understand the impact of ACEs and investing in preventive systems and services, we can provide solutions to many long-standing challenges we face as a state in health, mental health, social services, child protection, and juvenile and criminal justice systems; and

WHEREAS, the future economic development and prosperity of Tennessee depends on our ability to foster the health and well-being of the next generation by helping children and families build resilience to adversity through safe, stable, and nurturing relationships in the home and community;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim December, 2018 as
