PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, Esophageal Cancer kills on average one American every 32 minutes; and

WHEREAS, Esophageal Cancer is among the deadliest of cancers with fewer than one in five patients surviving five years; and

WHEREAS, Esophageal Cancer can be a silent killer with patients often unaware that the heartburn, difficulty swallowing, cough, hoarse voice, sore throat or chest pain they suffer from may be symptoms of Esophageal Cancer; and

WHEREAS, Esophageal Cancer is often discovered at advanced stages, but if discovered early, chances for recovery and survival are far better with current treatments; and

WHEREAS, Esophageal Cancer in the United States may be associated with persistent heartburn or gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD), yet many individuals are not aware of the potential danger GERD can present when it occurs over several years; and

WHEREAS, Esophageal Cancer can develop from GERD when fluids from the stomach regurgitate up into the esophagus resulting in cellular changes that may cause a precancerous condition known as Barrett's Esophagus, which may increase a patient's risk of developing Esophageal Cancer by 30-fold; and

WHEREAS, Esophageal Cancer awareness along with improvements in prevention such as avoiding tobacco and alcohol use, early detection and treatment strategies will enhance the health and well-being of all Americans;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim April 2019 as

Esophageal Cancer Hwareness Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
