PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, in 1839 the last detachment of Cherokees arrived in Indian Territory after removal from their ancestral homeland in the Southeast by the federal government on the infamous Trail of Tears; and

WHEREAS, this year commemorates the one hundred and eightieth anniversary of the end of that 1,000 mile journey where about 4,000 Cherokees perished along "The Place Where They Cried"; and

WHEREAS, the state of Tennessee is one of the states on the route the Cherokee people traveled in 1838 and 1839; and

WHEREAS, the will to survive and thrive enabled the Cherokee to rebuild their government in Indian Territory, what is now modern-day Oklahoma and

WHEREAS, each year, a group of Cherokee youth retrace the Trail of Tears Northern Route on bicycle, traveling more than 1,000 miles through seven states in memory of their ancestors; and

WHEREAS, this year marks the 35th anniversary of the memorial "Remember the Removal" Bike Ride; and

WHEREAS, this ride will travel through Tennessee on June 3-6, 2019;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim the week of June 2-8, 2019 as

Trail of Tears 180th Anniversary Remembrance Week

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
