PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, the people of Tennessee recognize the sacrifice of the members of our armed services and their families; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to honor those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in defense of our freedom; and

WHEREAS, we remember the families who have lost their loved ones in combat; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Army Captain Rufus J. Hyman of Memphis, Tennessee, was reported missing on July 30, 1950 while serving his country in Korean War; and

WHEREAS, Hyman, age 23, was assigned to Company A, 1st Battalion, 34th Infantry Regiment, 24th Infantry Division and was engaged in combat actions against the North Korean People's Army when he went missing; and

WHEREAS, his remains will be laid at rest a Arlington National Cemetery on October 9, 2019; and

WHEREAS, we are grateful to finally welcome home this brave soldier who made the ultimate sacrifice for his country;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim October 9, 2019 as a

Day of Mourning in Remembrance of Captain Rufus J. Hyman

and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
