PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, an estimated 56,000 people in the United States are diagnosed with pancreatic cancer each year and over 45,000 are likely to die from the disease;

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is one of the leading causes of cancer-related deaths in the United States;

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is the only major cancer with a five-year relative survival rate in the single digits at just nine percent;

WHEREAS, when symptoms of pancreatic cancer present themselves, it is generally in later stages, and about 65 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first year of their diagnosis;

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is the seventh most common cause of cancer-related deaths worldwide; and

WHEREAS, the good health and well-being of the residents of Tennessee are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about pancreatic cancer and research into early detection, causes and effective treatments;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim November 2019 as

Pancreatic Cancer Hwareness Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
