PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, neuroendocrine tumors/tumours (NETs) often develop into cancer, and if left untreated can result in serious illness and death; and

WHEREAS, NETs tend to grow slowly for many years, and symptoms typically do not show until the tumor has spread; and

WHEREAS, a large percentage of NETs cancer patients may harbor tumors for 3 to 7 years after symptoms appear before they are diagnosed; and

WHEREAS, when caught at an early stage, NETs cancer patients can have significantly improved outcomes and quality of life; and

WHEREAS, on this day, we raise awareness of NETs cancer and encourage citizens to learn more to encourage timely diagnosis and optimal treatment and care;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim November 10, 2012, as

NETs CANCER AWARENESS DAY

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
