PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, the spouses of our Service Members do not ask for recognition – they humbly support and fulfill their role as true partners, and in doing so are truly serving our great country as well; and

WHEREAS, in the year of 1984, President Ronald Regan recognized formally the commitment and importance of the spouse to the readiness and well-being of our Service Members; and

WHEREAS, the sacrifices and challenges that come with having a partner who serves in the military do not go unnoticed; and

WHEREAS, may we strive to ensure that, just as our military takes care of our Nation, we take care of the husbands and wives of our Armed Forces Members who shoulder the burden of household and family requirements during military absences; and

WHEREAS, as the military spouses in our community continue to love and serve their Service Member or Veteran, please know as we honor your loved one for their service, we also honor you;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim May 8, 2020 as

Military Spouses Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
