PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, Congenital Diaphragmatic Hernia (CDH) occurs when a baby's diaphragm fails to fully form; allowing abdominal organs into the chest cavity and preventing lung growth; and

WHEREAS, around one in every 2,200 live births are diagnosed with a congenital diaphragmatic hernia; and

WHEREAS, as many as 1,600 babies are born with CDH every year in the United States; and

WHEREAS, there are many people living in Tennessee who have been diagnosed with and have survived their CDH, although many families in Tennessee have endured the horrible pain and grief associated with the loss of loved ones with CDH; and

WHEREAS, those with CDH often endure multiple surgeries and possible medical complications beyond their diagnosis that include heart defects, pulmonary complications, gastric and intestinal problems, developmental delays, and may require respiratory and medicinal support for years; and

WHEREAS, raising awareness of this congenital defect will help bring about acceptance and support for those suffering with CDH, as well as highlight the need for medical research and advances;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim April 2021 as

Congenital Diaphragmatic Hernia Awareness Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
