## PROCLAMATION

## BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, general aviation and community airports play a critical role in the lives of our citizens, as well as in the operation of our businesses and farms; and

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee has a significant interest in the continued vitality of general aviation, aerospace, aircraft manufacturing, educational institutions and aviation organizations and community airports and airport operators; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Aeronautics Division reports that there are 78 system airports in the state, which, according to the FAA, serve 14,076 pilots and 5,904 registered aircraft; and

WHEREAS, according to the Aviation Economic Impact Study, Tennessee's airports support 220,936 jobs and a payroll of more than \$13 billion; and

WHEREAS, according to the FAA, the state is home to 52 repair stations, 9 FAA-approved flight schools, 3,827 student pilots and 2,671 flight instructors; and

WHEREAS, general aviation not only supports Tennessee's economy, it improves overall quality of life by supporting emergency medical and healthcare services, law enforcement, fire-fighting and disaster relief, investments in sustainable fuels and emerging technologies; and

WHEREAS, the nation's aviation infrastructure represents an important public benefit; and

WHEREAS, many communities in Tennessee depend heavily on general aviation and community airports for the continued flow of commerce, tourists and visitors to our State;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim March 2021 as

General Aviation Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
