



STATE OF TENNESSEE
PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, every Tennessean has the right to live free from harm and the fear of sexual assault or abuse; and

WHEREAS, no man, woman, or child has the right to force, coerce, threaten, or manipulate anyone into sexual activity; and

WHEREAS, sexual assault is a devastating crime that affects children, women, and men of all racial, cultural, and economic backgrounds in every community throughout Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the rate of sexual violence against women is unacceptable, with one out of six Tennessee women having experienced sexual violence in their lifetime; and

WHEREAS, the crime of sexual assault violates an individual's humanity, dignity, security, and privacy, where victims often suffer in silence for fear of further injury; and in addition to the initial trauma, victims and survivors too often experience long lasting impacts such as feelings of shame, or difficulty in personal relationships; and

WHEREAS, with leadership, dedication, and encouragement, there is compelling evidence that we can be successful in reducing sexual violence in Tennessee through prevention, education, increased awareness, and holding perpetrators who commit acts of violence accountable for their actions; and

WHEREAS, we must honor those victims around us and celebrate the resiliency and successes of survivors who, despite great obstacles, are thriving in communities across Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee is committed to prevention and to providing law enforcement and support for victims and survivors;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim April 2021 as

Sexual Assault Awareness Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
