WHEREAS, the great state of Tennessee has an active, productive ovarian cancer survivor population that is working to educate women and healthcare providers about the signs and symptoms of Ovarian Cancer; and

WHEREAS, we salute the survivors of this disease and those who support them;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim September 2021 as

Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
