PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, home health and safety hazards, including physical safety hazards, lead-based paint, radon, mold, pests, and allergens, cause or contribute to a wide range of illnesses and diseases, including lead poisoning, asthma, cancer, and injuries; and

WHEREAS, lead poisoning can negatively impact development of children, especially those under age six; and

WHEREAS, accidents in the home hurt thousands of people in our state every year; and

WHEREAS, children are often harmed as a result of chemicals stored and used improperly in the home; and

WHEREAS, across the country, on average, at least 430 die each year from carbon monoxide poisoning and 50,000 more visit emergency rooms due to this serious household threat; and

WHEREAS, many of our state's families and households are unaware that their homes can have serious health hazards; and

WHEREAS, education and awareness about the dangers of unhealthy or unsafe housing can save lives and protect families;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim June 2021 as

Healthy Homes Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
