PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, cancer is the leading cause of death by disease among U.S. children 1-14 years of age and this tragic disease is detected in nearly 10,000 of our country's young people less than 15 years of age each and every year; and

WHEREAS, every year, almost 1300 children less than 15 years of age lose his or her battle with cancer and many children may experience secondary cancers later in childhood or as an adult as a result of the treatment received during their battle against cancer; and

WHEREAS, the National Cancer Institute recognizes the unique research needs of childhood cancer and the associated need for increased funding to carry this out; and

WHEREAS, hundreds of non-profit organizations at the local and national level are helping children with cancer and their families cope through educational, emotional and financial support; and

WHEREAS, researchers and healthcare professionals work diligently dedicating their expertise to treat and cure children with cancer, and

WHEREAS, too many children are affected by this deadly disease and more must be done to raise awareness and find a cure;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim September 2021 as

Childhood Cancer Awareness Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
