PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, Tennessee's 60 municipal power distributors and 23 electric cooperatives distribute reliable electric power for the majority of the state's residential, commercial and industrial customers; and

WHEREAS, many of Tennessee's public power cities and towns have been electric providers for more than 75 years; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's public power utilities are valuable community assets that contribute to the well-being of the community and provide economic development opportunities; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's public power utilities are dependable institutions that provide excellent service and a commitment to community; and

WHEREAS, this designation of the week of October 7-13, 2012, as the 26th annual Public Power Week, will serve to make its consumer owners, policy makers, and employees more aware of public power's overall contributions to their well-being;

NOW, THEREFORE, I Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim the week of October 7-13, 2012 as
