## PROCLAMATION

## BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, Bays Mountain Park and Planetarium in Kingsport, Tennessee is celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2021, having opened to visitors in 1971; and

WHEREAS, Bays Mountain Park is home to an ecological diverse 3,550 acre nature preserve and is one of the nation's largest city-owned parks; and

WHEREAS, Bays Mountain Park adds to Tennessee's rich natural environment, including approximately 40 miles of trails, a state-of-the-art planetarium, wildlife habitats and exhibits, a 44-acre lake, and an adventure ropes course; and

WHEREAS, Bays Mountain Park has over 200,000 visitors annually, including school groups and family trips from around the state and beyond; and

WHEREAS, Bays Mountain Park's emphasis on education, preservation and outdoor adventure provides abundant opportunity to explore, while promoting improved health and wellness and positive economic impact in the region; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to recognize the efforts to preserve and promote this unique place to enjoy nature and both recreate and learn outdoors; and

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim May 24, 2021, as
