PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, it is important to increase awareness of serious illnesses that affect the lives of citizens of Tennessee such as PANDAS (Pediatric Autoimmune Neuropsychiatric Disorders Associated with Streptococcal Infections), PANS (Pediatric Acute-onset Neuropsychiatric Syndromes), and BGE (Basal Ganglia Encephalitis); and

WHEREAS, a diagnosis of PANDAS, PANS, or BGE means a child has a sudden, dramatic onset of neuropsychiatric symptoms, such as Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD) symptoms. Accompanying symptoms may include tics, anxiety, depression, behavioral regression, deterioration in school performance, sensory abnormalities, severely restricted food intake, and more; and

WHEREAS, most cases of PANS are thought to result from an abnormal autoimmune or inflammatory response in the brain following an infection. When the patient has had a recent streptococcal infection, he or she is diagnosed with PANDAS, a subtype of PANS; and

WHEREAS, PANDAS/PANS/BGE is rare and more data is needed to determine the prevalence, these conditions can seriously affect a child's health; and

WHEREAS, PANDAS/PANS/BGE may be underdiagnosed and treatment depends on the type and severity of symptoms and cause (if known) but may include antibiotics, steroids, IVIG (intravenous immunoglobulin), Plasmapheresis, Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, and anti-inflammatory medications; and

WHEREAS, PANDAS network.org is a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation dedicated to improving the diagnosis and treatment of PANDAS/PANS/BGE, PANDAS Network is also a conduit for collaborative research and a source of information for the medical community; and

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim October 9, 2021 as PANDAS/PANS/BGE Awareness Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
