PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is among the least understood of all the major cancers; and

WHEREAS, one of the deadliest forms of cancer, pancreatic cancer is the third leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States and it has the lowest five-year survival rate at about 11%; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated by the American Cancer Society that in 2021, 60,430 Americans will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, and 48,220 will die from the disease; and

WHEREAS, in 2012, the U.S. Congress passed the Recalcitrant Cancer Research Act, which calls on the National Cancer Institute to develop a scientific framework for pancreatic cancer and other recalcitrant cancers that may help provide the strategic direction and guidance needed to make true progress against the disease; and

WHEREAS, the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network is the national organization serving the pancreatic cancer community in Tennessee and nationwide through a comprehensive approach that includes public policy, research funding, patient services, and public awareness and education related to developing effective treatments and a cure for pancreatic cancer; and

WHEREAS, the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network and its affiliates in Tennessee support those patients currently battling pancreatic cancer, and are committed to nothing less than a cure; and

WHEREAS, the good health and well-being of the residents of Tennessee are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about pancreatic cancer and the research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments;

NOW, THEREFORE, I Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim November 18, 2021, as

Pancreatic Cancer Hwareness Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
