PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, all children and youth deserve to grow, develop, and have their needs met by being placed with families who can offer a permanent home; and

WHEREAS, in 2021, 1,221 Tennessee children, ranging in age from newborn to 18 years, exited foster care and were adopted into forever families; and

WHEREAS, in 2021, 385 Tennessee children also joined forever families through the establishment of permanent guardianship; and

WHEREAS, in 2021, for the fourth consecutive year the Department of Children's Services set a record for the number of children who joined forever families through adoption or permanent guardianship; and

WHEREAS, through TN Foster's Hope, a statewide collaborative effort that engages state agencies, community organizations, the business community, and the faith community, more resources have been placed to better meet the needs of our foster and adopted children and families; and

WHEREAS, the families who have adopted and the children waiting for adoptive families deserve love, support, and acceptance from their communities and from public and private agencies; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Department of Children's Services commends the love, commitment, and care of families who have committed to caring for Tennessee's children and their contributions to the safety and well-being of youth in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Department of Children's Services is grateful for families who have opened their hearts and their homes to create paths to permanency through adoption and permanent guardianship;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim February 13-19, 2022, as

Adoption is Love Week

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
