## PROCLAMATION

## BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, every year Tennesseans face severe weather threats from flash floods, flooding, hailstorms, lightning, thunderstorms, and tornadoes; and

WHEREAS, severe weather is a danger to life, health and property; and

WHEREAS, public awareness and education about the threat of severe weather is necessary to help every Tennessean prepare to protect themselves, their families and their neighbors; and

WHEREAS, local, state, federal departments, and agencies, along with elected leaders, news media, professional associations, and volunteers, are committed to informing and educating all Tennesseans about severe weather preparedness; and,

WHEREAS, all Tennesseans need to understand the importance of preparedness and have situational awareness about the threats around them; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Emergency Management Agency and the Tennessee offices of the National Weather Service want all Tennesseans to learn about severe weather safety;

**NOW THEREFORE,** I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim the week of February 20 - 26, 2022, as

Severe Weather Awareness Week

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
