PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, The Institute of Internal Auditors, the internal audit profession's most widely recognized advocate, educator, and provider of standards, guidance, and certifications, celebrates its 81st anniversary in 2022; and

WHEREAS, the global internal audit profession promotes awareness about its value and the contribution of internal auditors to the success of organizations and the global economy at large, every year during the month of May; and

WHEREAS, Internal Audit Awareness Month presents an opportunity to recognize, acknowledge, and commend the efforts and contributions of internal auditors in corporations, not-for-profit organizations, and in state and local governments throughout the great state of Tennessee;
