PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, on August 2, 2022, the Department of Transportation was notified about a slope failure on Interstate 75 in Campbell County at mile marker 152.2;

WHEREAS, the condition of the slope at this location of Interstate 75 remains unstable;

WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation closed the outside lane and shoulder of the roadway due to the roadway being undermined;

WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation has built a temporary travel lane to shift traffic away from the failure until repairs can be made; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation will be utilizing emergency contract for repair and stabilization of the roadway slope at this location on Interstate 75.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Tennessee Constitution and law, including but not limited to Tenn. Code Ann. § 58-2-107(b) do hereby declare a state of emergency existed in Campbell County in Tennessee. Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 58-2-107(b)(2), this state of emergency will remain in effect until I have determined that the emergency conditions no longer exist; provided that in no event will the state of emergency continue for longer than forty-five (45) additional days, unless specifically renewed.
