BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, today, Tennessee is proud to be home to a growing Latino community who strengthen the rich culture of our State; and

WHEREAS, the entrepreneurial spirit and economic contributions of the Latino population provide renewed evidence of the American Dream and the promise of economic opportunity for all; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Latino community embodies Tennessee values, including faith, work ethic, and a volunteer spirit; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's cultural, economic, and civil society are strengthened by the innumerable contributions of the Latino community;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim September 15th - October 15th, 2022, as
