PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, in 2022, an estimated 62,210 people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the United States and 49,830 will die from the disease; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is one of the deadliest cancers and is the 3rd leading cause of cancer-related deaths in the United States; and

WHEREAS, when symptoms of pancreatic cancer present themselves, it is generally late stage, and approximately 89 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first five years; and

WHEREAS, over 1000 Tennesseans died from pancreatic cancer in 2022; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is the 7th most common cause of cancer-related death in men and women across the world; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 495,773 new pancreatic cancer cases were diagnosed globally in 2020; and

WHEREAS, the good health and well-being of Tennessee residents are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about pancreatic cancer, its early detection, causes, and effective treatments;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim November 17, 2022 as

Pancreatic Cancer Hwareness Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
