PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, President Ronald Wilson Reagan, born February 6, 1911, was a man of humble background, who served as governor of the State of California and two terms as president of the United States; and

WHEREAS, by his second term in office President Reagan garnered the support of 60% of the electorate - a record unsurpassed in the history of American presidential elections; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan's commitment to the idea of "peace through strength," led to the end of the Cold War and the defeat of communism; and

WHEREAS, his commitment to our armed forces contributed to the restoration of pride in America; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee do hereby proclaim February 6, 2023, as

Ronald Reagan Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
