PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, every Tennessean has the right to live free from harm and the fear of sexual assault or abuse; and

WHEREAS, no man, woman, or child has the right to force, coerce, threaten, or manipulate anyone into sexual activity; and

WHEREAS, sexual assault is a devastating crime that affects children, women, and men of all racial, cultural, and economic backgrounds in every community throughout Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the rate of sexual violence against women is unacceptable, with one in six female Tennesseans having experienced sexual violence during their lifetime; and

WHEREAS, the crime of sexual assault violates an individual's humanity, dignity, security, and privacy, which often leaves victims to suffer in silence for fear of further injury; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the initial trauma, both victims and survivors often experience longlasting impacts such as feelings of shame or difficulty in personal relationships; and

WHEREAS, we should honor victims around us and celebrate the resiliency and success of survivors who, despite great obstacles, are thriving in communities across Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee is committed to prevention; and providing law enforcement and support for victims and survivors;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim April 2023 as

Sexual Assault Awareness Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
