PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, trisomy is the presence within a person's cells of a single extra chromosome, yielding a total of three chromosomes instead of a pair. As a type of aneuploidy, trisomy can occur with any of an individual's 23 pairs of chromosomes; and

WHEREAS, the most common trisomies in newborns are trisomy 21 (Down syndrome), trisomy 18 (Edwards syndrome), and trisomy 13 (Patau syndrome); and

WHEREAS, local support groups, medical professionals, and online communities offer education, encouragement, and counseling for those managing trisomy pregnancies or raising trisomy-affected children; and

WHEREAS, through increased awareness and education on all forms of trisomy, Tennesseans will be better equipped to support families currently experiencing trisomy, and participate in helping people with developmental disabilities achieve their full potential;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee do hereby proclaim March 2023 as

Trisomy Hwareness Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
