## PROCLAMATION

## BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, nearly 40% of all food produced in the U.S. goes to waste, including Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, a family of four typically wastes an average of \$1500 per year on uneaten food; and

WHEREAS, the total economic loss associated with food waste is estimated to be approximately \$218 billion per year; and

WHEREAS, 1 in 8 Tennesseans and 1 in 6 children experience food insecurity, meaning they lack consistent access to nutritious food; and

WHEREAS, through education and awareness regarding ways to reduce food waste, Tennessee households, local food banks and other like-services will experience a positive impact; and

WHEREAS, by engaging citizens, households, businesses, and other entities with the resource information and strategies for addressing food waste countless lives will be improved;

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim April 10-16, 2023 as

2nd Annual Food Waste Hwareness Week

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
