PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, in 1969, President Richard M. Nixon signed a proclamation designating the month of January as National Blood Donor Month; and

WHEREAS, every two seconds someone in the United States needs a blood transfusion; and

WHEREAS, blood donation saves 12,000 lives a day in the United States, which in Tennessee would be approximately 250 a day, and 90,000 annually, and

WHEREAS, more than 15 million pints of blood are transfused in the United States each year, which would be approximately 315,000 pints annually in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, 65% of the population are eligible to donate and only 3% do so; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee is home to several committed public service and private organizations working to raise awareness of the importance of blood donation; and

WHEREAS, during the month of January we celebrate our citizens who already donate blood and encourage those who are eligible to schedule an appointment today;

NOW, THEREFORE, I Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee do hereby proclaim January 2024 as

Blood Donor Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
