PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, President Ronald Wilson Reagan, born on February 6, 1911, was a man of humble background, served in the United States Army Reserves, and was employed as an entertainer, governor of California and president of the United States; and

WHEREAS, Reagan served two terms as the 40th president of the United States of America; the second of which he earned the confidence of three-fifths of the electorate and was victorious in 49 of the 50 states in the general election - a record unsurpassed in the history of American presidential elections; and

WHEREAS, in 1981, when Reagan was inaugurated President, he inherited a disillusioned nation shackled by rampant inflation and high unemployment; and

WHEREAS, Reagan's sunny optimism and strong belief in the power of the individual revitalized the nation in one of the longest economic expansions in American history; and

WHEREAS, Reagan's commitment to our armed forces allowed America to achieve "peace through strength," and prepared America's Armed Forces to meet 21st century challenges; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan's Berlin Wall speech marked the end the Cold War and contributed to the demise of the Soviet Union, freeing millions of people from the shackles of communism;

NOW, THEREFORE, in an effort to honor the former President and his legacy of service to the United States, I Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim February 6, 2024 as

Ronald Reagan Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
