PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, nearly half of all college students say they fear social stigma in reaching out for support in their mental health and substance misuse needs; and

WHEREAS, alcohol misuse is highest among young adults attending college; and

WHEREAS, mental health diagnoses continues to rise in young adults attending college; and

WHEREAS, a person's ability to achieve and maintain recovery is strongly influenced their environment; and

WHEREAS, there is significant opportunity for colleges to ensure that young adults are well supported in maintaining their mental health and recovery from substance abuse disorder; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Collegiate Recovery Initiative has worked with more than 30 universities and colleges, public and private, since its initiation in 2021; and

WHEREAS, these efforts have resulted in the creation of more than 2,000 recovery allies and four Certified Recovery-Friendly Campuses across Tennessee;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim April 15-19, 2024 as

Collegiate Recovery Week

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
