PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, October 7, 2024, marks one year since the horrific terror attacks against the Nation of Israel and the Jewish people; and

WHEREAS, on the morning of October 7, 2023, more than 3,000 Hamas terrorists attacked Israel and committed crimes against humanity, resulting in the deaths of more than 1,200 men, women, elderly, and children and 250 hostages kidnapped and taken into Gaza; and

WHEREAS, in the days following October 7, 2023, anti-Israel protests across the world, including on many American streets and college campuses, featured antisemitic chants and support for Hamas; and

WHEREAS, 101 hostages, including Americans Keith Siegal (64), Sagui Dekel-Chen (35), Omer Neutra (22), and Edan Alexander (20) and the bodies of Judy Weinstein, Itay Chen, and Gad Haggai remain in Gaza held by Hamas; and

WHEREAS, throughout history, Jewish people across the globe have faced unspeakable persecution, and the October 7, 2023, terror attacks perpetrated by Hamas and the ensuing rise of antisemitism worldwide are stark reminders of the immense tragedy the Jewish people have endured; and

WHEREAS, we mourn the innocent lives lost since October 7, 2023, and continue to lift the many victims and their families up in prayer; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee has a long history of supporting the Nation of Israel and will always stand with Israel and the Jewish people;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby declare and proclaim October 7, 2024, as

October 7th Remembrance Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
