PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, 250 years ago, on April 19, 1775, the American Revolutionary War began in the colony of Massachusetts where "the shot heard round the world" was fired at Lexington and Concord, marking the first stand in the fight for independence and the birth of a nation founded on liberty and self-governance; and

WHEREAS, the battle between British Regulars and colonial militia further sparked the flame of rebellion throughout the American colonies and territories, inspiring all Americans to stand against tyranny and fight for independence; and

WHEREAS, the brave colonial settlers and militia in western North Carolina, which would become the Territory of the United States South of the Ohio River and then the state of Tennessee, joined in the fight against British oppression, risking their lives throughout the War for Independence, most notably at the Battle of King's Mountain; and

WHEREAS, these brave men and women fighting against tyranny, known as patriots, risked their lives, fortunes, and sacred honor in the pursuit of freedom, laying the foundation for the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Tennessee cherish the freedoms and rights established by our nation's founders and patriots; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting to reflect upon and celebrate the freedoms secured through their struggle, to educate future generations about the values of perseverance and unity, and to reaffirm our commitment to upholding these ideals;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim April 19, 2025 as

Patriot Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
