



STATE OF TENNESSEE
PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, this year marks the 51st Anniversary of the end of American involvement in the Vietnam War; and

WHEREAS, over 58,000 of the more than 3 million men and women who served in the Vietnam War made the ultimate sacrifice, nearly 1,300 of whom were Tennesseans; and

WHEREAS, as Americans and Tennesseans, we will always honor the legacy of those who served our country, were wounded, or lost their lives in battle, and we can never repay our debt of gratitude for the courage they demonstrated; and

WHEREAS, in 2008, the State of Tennessee enacted legislation to designate March 29th as Vietnam Veterans Day in honor of those who served our country during this 20 year-long conflict; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee is proud to be called home by more than 160,000 Vietnam veterans; and

WHEREAS, Vietnam War Veterans Day is an opportunity to honor all Vietnam veterans and their families, recognizing the valuable contributions they continue to make in their communities and throughout our state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim March 29, 2026 as

Vietnam Veterans Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
