PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, on August 8, 2013, torrential rain and flash flooding occurred and resulted in emergency conditions in Davidson County; and

WHEREAS, this severe weather resulted in damage in excess of several million dollars; and

WHEREAS, emergency personnel have gathered additional information from the devastating impact of this flooding, and it has become clear that a state of emergency has existed and continues to exist since August 8, 2013.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Tennessee Constitution and law, including but not limited to Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 58-2-107(b), do hereby declare a state of emergency in Tennessee. Pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 58-2-107(b)(2), this state of emergency will remain in effect until I have determined that the emergency conditions no longer exist; provided, that in no event will the state of emergency continue for longer than sixty (60) days, unless specifically renewed.
