PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, More than 43,000 people are killed each year in crashes on American highways and roads; and

WHEREAS, Many of these fatal car crashes may be avoided by simply exercising patience, caution and awareness on the roads; and

WHEREAS, Drivers should prepare themselves for the unpredictable behaviors other drivers, disabled vehicles, spilled cargo, adverse weather conditions and many other potential dangers that they may encounter on roadways; and

WHEREAS, It is always important for drivers to focus on driving, eliminate distractions, maintain safe speeds and rive defensively to avoid preventable accidents; and

WHEREAS, Many individuals and organizations in Tennessee are working to increase awareness of the need for driver safety; and

WHEREAS, the Sunday after the Thanksgiving holiday is traditionally the busiest highway travel day of the year;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, proclaim December 1, 2013 as

Drive Safer Sunday

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
