



STATE OF TENNESSEE
PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, Robert E. Lee was born January 19, 1807, in Virginia, a state which furnished many who became leading citizens of Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, Robert E. Lee graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point in 1829 and entered public service as an officer in the United States Army; and

WHEREAS, Robert E. Lee ably fulfilled various assignments in that capacity until resigning April 20, 1861 to accept appointment as an officer in the Army of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, Robert E. Lee concluded in 1865 that the Confederate States could no longer successfully resist the Union Army and surrendered his army to General U. S. Grant at Appomattox Court House, thus ending the war; and

WHEREAS, Robert E. Lee after Appomattox devoted his life as a civilian to binding up the wounds of the war and reuniting the splintered United States of America; and

WHEREAS, Robert E. Lee ministered to the young men of the postwar period through his office as President of Washington University, an institution that later added his name to its own: Washington and Lee University of Lexington, Virginia; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated 15-2-101 requires that the governor proclaim January 19 of each year as "Robert E. Lee Day;" and

WHEREAS, Robert E. Lee is widely recognized as one of the outstanding Americans of the nineteenth century;

NOW, THEREFORE, I Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim January 19, 2014 as

Robert E. Lee Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
