PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, on May 30, 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that established June 14th as Flag Day; and

WHEREAS, we celebrate June 14th as the day when the new nation adopted the flag of the United States in 1777; and

WHEREAS, our country's flag remains a symbol that represents our land, our people, our government and the ideals of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, our flag has flown over the launching of space shuttles, the bombing of our ships, and hometown football games; and

WHEREAS, the American flag has been waved enthusiastically by jubilant children at parades and clutched by a grieving widow who no longer has her husband to hold because he made the ultimate sacrifice; and

WHEREAS, freedom, justice, equality, opportunity and hope are symbolized in the red, white, and blue of the flag that we proudly fly; and

WHEREAS, as a nation we must remember the great sacrifices that have been paid to keep our flag flying high and free today;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim June 14, 2014, as Flag Day and the week of June 9-15, 2014 as

Flag Week

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
