



STATE OF TENNESSEE
PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, suicide is one of the most disruptive and tragic events a family and a community can experience; and

WHEREAS, more than 900 lives are lost in Tennessee each year and it is estimated that for every suicide, there is an average of 8-25 attempted suicides; and

WHEREAS, suicide is the ninth-leading cause of death in Tennessee and the second-leading cause of death among people from the age of 15 to 24; and

WHEREAS, public awareness of this heartbreaking problem is the key to preventing further suffering and loss of life; and

WHEREAS, this risk can be reduced through education and treatment; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee is a national leader in the effort to prevent suicide, being one of the first states to develop a suicide prevention and evaluation plan covering the lifespan; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of Tennessee has appointed a Suicide Prevention Network Advisory Council to coordinate the implementation of the Tennessee Strategy for Suicide Prevention; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Suicide Prevention Network is a grassroots collaboration of Tennesseans and organizations working to eliminate the stigma of suicide, educate the community about the warning signs of suicide, and ultimately reduce the rate of suicide in our state; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Suicide Prevention Network is also committed to excellence in suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim September 2014, as

Suicide Prevention Awareness Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
